Our start-up story

and new ideas to address challenges in
our region, and to explore opportunities.

Inspiration for our programming

Our work over the last two years was developed in response to:

- outcomes from the <u>Mapping Our Road to Recovery</u> online discussion series
- what we were learning and hearing from the community during the pandemic
- the UN Habitat in Towns: Collingwood World Summits, and
- Canada's commitment to the UN Sustainable Development Goals

Canada and 192 other countries signed on to the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with a deadline to achieve them by 2030. We began to explore how we might create integrated, resilient and equitable transformations toward sustainability across Southern Georgian Bay.



A Call for Collaboration & ACTION!

Our Four Priority areas respond to SDG 11 which includes these interconnected issues:

- affordable housing
- addressing environmental and transportation challenges
- nurturing cultural assets
- protecting natural assets
- providing universal access to green and public space
- practicing integrated planning and management, and

supporting positive economic, social, and environmental links between urban and rural. This is especially important as our region is an area where rural and urban communities meet.

fosters a balanced, integrated economy with triple bottom lines: social benefits, environmental benefits, and economic benefits. It highlights new directions in ways we "do business" regardless of our sector.

BUSINESS & INNOVATION

2019

Social Innovation event and workshop, in-person Collingwood; featured the Centre for Social Innovation; Introduced relavtively new Social Finance concepts including Social Enterprises, social entrepreneurs and community bonds.

2021

Our Sustainable Future series and learning about the potential for what a "next economy" could look like and the benefits for our region. Introduced regional CAOs to each other, brought regional Mayors together publically for the first time, and presented guidance from sustainability experts and innovative solution leaders.

2022/23

Discussions with Georgian College about Social Entrepreneur/ Social Enterprise digital educational assets to share and their interest in creating a Community of Practice; discussions with Community Foundations Grey Bruce about their work distributing the Federal Investment Readiness Program grants (part of a \$750 million fund over 10 years).

2020

Mapping our Road to Recovery series- exploring the potential of new ideas for pandemic recovery plans- doing things differently and increasing positive outcomes through social investment strategies, including the arts, business, philanthropy and the role of municipalities.

2022

Local Sustainable Economies series explored integrated economies and new directions for business with triple bottom lines, including Social Enterprises and B-Corps; helped launch the SGB Innovation Fund.

SOCIAL FINANCE & AFFORDABLE HOUSING

EARLY 2020 -

Over the first year of the pandemic, it became clear that access to capital for addressing social issues was becoming increasingly difficult.

2021

A Social Finance Learning Group forms, meeting bi-weekly to study the new tools and strategies being used in other jurisdictions to help address affordable housing, climate action, and food systems.

2022

Virtual events: Key Elements to Build Sustainable Communities and Sustainable Affordable Housing: Data to Drive Effective Decision-Making.

JUNE 2020

A social finance and investment strategy was a topic of exploration in our community discussion series Mapping Our Road to Recovery.

FALL 2021

This group became the Social Finance & Housing Group and shifted their focus to affordable housing and the use of Social Finance tools to accelerate progress.


